| I hope all of our families enjoyed their long weekend. Teachers were thankful to get their reports finished. Reports now come to senior management for checking so they can go home with students in two weeks time. At this time of year teachers and leaders are busy looking at our student achievement data for the year. We take a lot of time in analysing data so we can identify needs or gaps and look at what future interventions we need to put in place to support these. We also look closely to see what progress has been made by individuals and by cohorts of children. It is always great to see big shifts in achievement and to be able to celebrate these successes. | We measure children against the curriculum. Our New Zealand curriculum is split into curriculum levels and each curriculum level should take two years to work through. Year 1 and 2 students work at Level 1 of the curriculum, year 3 and 4 students work at Level 2 of the curriculum and year 5 and 6 should be working at Level 3 of the curriculum. | |
| Teachers use a range of tools to help them make a judgment about what level of the curriculum children are working at. As each curriculum level is quite broad, we narrow it down by identifying if children are working at the beginning of a level, working within a level or on the way to transitioning to the next level up. You will see this terminology in this year's reports. | |
| There are some standardized tests that teachers use to help them make these judgements: | |
| <u>PAT</u> - Progress and Achievement Tests. Children in years 3-6 sit PAT's for a range of subjects. Currently we are analysing our PAT maths and our PAT vocabulary results. PAT's give students a scaled score. By comparing scaled scores from the beginning of the year to now we can see both progress and achievement. | |
| <u>e-asTTle-</u> Children in years 4-6 sit e-asTTle tests in reading and maths. When children sit an e-asTTle test they will receive an <i>individual pathway</i> which identifies | |

what curriculum level they are at; it will also highlight their strengths and identify some next steps. Teachers are happy to talk to you about your students progress and to share test results.

School Accounts - Kindo

We have been using Kindo as our school shop for over a year. Instructions on how to set up a Kindo account are on our school website. Any payments to the school need to be coming through Kindo. We still have a few parents who have set up **automatic payments** to our school account; these transactions need to be **cancelled.**

Our office ladies reconcile payments in Kindo, it becomes more complicated and an added workload if they also need to check our school bank accounts.

If you do not already have a Kindo account please set one up. Please STOP any automatic payments to our school account.

We are currently putting together our Stationery Lists for 2021 and you will receive these with your child's school report later this term. We will no longer be selling Stationery Packs from school at the beginning of each year. Stationery can be ordered and paid for online through Qizzle, who put all our stationery packs together for us, or you can purchase through a provider of your own choice. If you do not have internet access to complete your online order or you need support with your stationery purchase for 2021, you will have the

Kiwi Can

This year all classes from year 2 up have been having weekly Kiwi Can lessons. It is great when learning can be fun!

Kiwi Can leaders Chris and Steve are teaching the students about how important it is in making sure everyone feels safe. To get this learning intention across to the class, they are playing the game called "lava".

With Positive Relationships being the Kiwi Can focus for Term 4, this game is all about getting your team from one end to the other without falling in the lava. They must work together with lily pads, communicate and co-operate together so that they all get across and don't fall in! If they fall, everyone must begin again.

Playing these sorts of games teaches our students that we need to learn how to get along with others. To communicate calmly even if we have a struggle that we must face. To be there for each other and to make sure everyone is feeling safe.









School Donation Scheme

This year we have opted into the Government's Donation Scheme; this has meant that trips and activities that we would usually ask parents to pay for have been covered by this funding, e.g., swimming, shows, class excursions. I hope parents have felt the positive impact of this scheme.

Activities like extension writing courses or Thursday night basketball are not covered by this scheme as individual children opt into these; they are not a part of our standard curriculum and only involve a small number of children.

As teachers, we have enjoyed being able to organise events without worrying about asking parents to pay for them. Our Board has decided to opt into the scheme for 2021.

Camp is one big expense and it happens every second year for students in years 4-6. We know many children have already fundraised for camp by selling chocolates. We also have some donation scheme money left over from this year that we will carry forward to 2021 to help with camp costs. However, even with next year's donation scheme money there will not be enough to cover the cost of camp. Therefore, in 2021 we will be asking parents to *contribute* toward part of the camp costs. Jan Thompson, the Team Miro leader, will calculate exact camp costs at the beginning of 2021 and let families know how much additional funding will need to be contributed by families.
