Attendance

Ensure your child is at school on time every day!

Please ensure your child arrives at school by 8:55am. Unless they are unwell send them to school. Try not to book appointments in the day which would mean they leave early. Don't keep them home from school on their birthdays. We need



your child at school every day for the full six hours so we can optimise learning potential.

 \mathbf{H} – make getting your child to school on time the right thing to do.

 \mathbf{E} – help your child to maximize all learning opportunities in their classroom by being here for the full day.

A – show your child you care about their learning – being on time is important.

 \mathbf{R} – respect your child and your child's teacher by having your child ready and organised to learn. \mathbf{T} – together we can achieve the best for your child.

A child who is late every day this term would miss over 4 hours of learning opportunities.

A child who misses one day a week of learning will have missed a whole year of learning by the time they finish year five.

Parking

This is my termly moan about parking around our school. We have a few parents who are stopping on the footpath outside the school and dropping children

HEART Values

Children are sharing with parents about our values. To help reinforce our values at home even further I have included three HEART tokens for you as a parent to use. (*They are at the bottom of page 4*). You can use them with your own children or when you come into the school grounds you can give them to a child who you see using HEART. Try to be explicit with your language when you give them out, acknowledging what they are for, e.g., *Tama, this is for showing excellence, your bedroom is spotless. Mohamed, this is for showing aroha, you are playing well with your sister.*

Stranger Danger

Please take time to talk to your children about what to do if a stranger approaches them and offers them a lift.

- Never get in a car or go off with a stranger.
- Be wary that people may entice children with cute pets, money, expensive cars or the story that they have been sent by a parent to pick them up.
- Set up a family *code word* that children could ask a stranger for if they said they knew the family.
- Remind children to run back into school grounds if they are approached outside our gates.
- Get children to tell you or a known adult immediately if they are approached.

We are not aware of any threats in our immediate vicinity, however, we do know that some schools in Christchurch have had children approached by strangers so this is an opportune time to have a conversation with your child and to give them some safety tips.

Matariki Week begins 25 June

Matariki is the Māori name for the cluster of stars also known as the Pleiades. It rises in mid-winter – late May or early June. For many Māori, it heralds the start of a new year. This year Matariki will begin on 25 June.

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Student Council PINK SHIRT DAY This Friday 26 May

On Friday 26 May, Banks Avenue School will celebrate Pink Shirt Day. Pink Shirt Day is all about taking action and standing together to stop bullying. It aligns with our value of TOGETHERNESS-*Together is better*.

Aggressive behaviour can be labelled bullying when there is:

• An imbalance of power: Kids who bully use their power—such as physical strength, age, size, year level, access to embarrassing information, or popularity to control or harm others.



• Repetition: Bullying behaviors happen more than once directed at the

same child /children over a reasonable time frame.

Bullying includes actions such as making threats, spreading rumours, attacking someone physically or verbally, and excluding someone from a group on purpose. Children will bully other children, however, sometimes adults will then bully children.

Bullying behaviour is never acceptable and it must be stamped out.

Types of Care:

Foster Care –is for a period of time with the goal that the child will return to their own family or into a permanent home.

Emergency Care – a child may come to you for a few days or a longer period, depending on the family circumstances.

Respite Care – is looking after a child for short periods as a support for their parents or main carers.

Home for life – is when a child is not able to return home and you become their lifelong carers, as part of your family.
