Dear Parents and Whānau

Strike 29 May

We greatly appreciate the community support that we have already received following the decision by teachers and principals to strike on Wednesday 29 May. The decision to take further strike action was not taken lightly by any of us. For the first time, both primary and secondary teachers are striking together because the crisis in education hits us all very hard and we need the Government to understand how serious it is. Schools are grappling with the fallout of a 40% nosedive in the number of people training to be teachers between 2010 and 2016, even while the population grew by 400,000. While the situation improved a little last year and the Government has announced an urgent \$95m package to recruit teachers, this is not sufficient to address the crisis. Schools struggle daily to find enough teachers to meet their relief teacher needs and this will worsen as winter approaches. There is also a desperate need for more support for children with additional learning needs.

The fact is that teaching is no longer considered an attractive profession due to long-term under-funding of the education sector. A significant pay jolt is part of the solution, alongside significant improvements to our heavy workloads. Otherwise our schools will end up with larger class sizes and more teachers leaving.

We would love to see you and your children standing with us – together we are a community and we can make a difference.

At the end of the speakers, we will march as a group of approximately 4000. The route has been selected to get the crowd to the MOE the most direct and quickest way. Although there are not a lot of road crossings and foot paths on this route we do need people to keep safe, off the road and follow the marshals' directions.

Teacher Only Day Friday 31 May

Each year we start back at school earlier than some of our neighbouring schools as that allows us to have two teacher only days during the year.

Teacher only days are invaluable for getting substantial amounts of professional development done without interruption.

Our second and last teacher only day for 2019 will be on **Friday 31 May**. School will be closed on this day. This is Queens Birthday weekend so some families may like to take the Friday to have a four day weekend.

The junior module will be attending the Playhouse Theatre on Friday 7th June – there is a cost of \$4 per child and will need to be paid by Tuesday 4th June.

Support Staff day

As mentioned in our last newsletter much of our work at school could not be achieved without our support staff. Last Thursday many of our classes and students showed



their gratitude by giving compliments and cards to these valued people who often demonstrate all of our HEART values in a day. Because of this they were given the Respect wristband to commemorate the day.

Pasifika Group

We have hired a tutor to run a Pasifika group for an hour once a week. All children are welcome to join this group but we would really like to encourage our Pasifika children to join and help us celebrate their culture. The first session with Feleti will be on 7 June. These sessions will run from 12 to 12:50 every Friday.

Tūranga and Kura Pounamu Visit

The children in Team Miro visited the Canterbury Museum where they learnt the history of pounamu and the myths and legends associated with this precious stone. On this EOTC trip they also went behind the scenes at Tūranga the Canterbury Library, dancing behind the scenes with a robot and learning about children's literature in detail. Did you know that the library processes 14 000 books a day? Wow!

HEART Values

Our school HEART values are central to all that we do at Banks Avenue School. You will read about our values in newsletters and I know your children will talk about them at home.

All children are able to earn HEART tokens. These will be given out for showing explicit expected behaviours in the classroom by the class teachers and relievers. They will also be given out in the playground by duty teachers. Teachers will identify to the child why they have earned the token e.g. Amber this token is for aroha - you were very kind asking Moana to join in with your group.

Once a child has received a HEART token they will collection box their into a hand it classroom. Teachers will tally and record how many tokens each child earns under each of our values.

25 HEART tokens (same value) - name in newsletter 50 HEART tokens (same value) - a wristband

Two or more wristbands the same - lunch with the principal. Ultimately, children are trying to earn all five wristbands. Once they have done this and then collected an additional fifty tokens they will receive the black HEART wrist band which depicts strong school citizenship.


lamps representing the stars in the distance.


We were excited last night at the Town Hall because we won! What an incredible effort - well done to all involved. This is awesome!
